THE TISSUE BANK

The tissue bank initiative at OSU stores cancerous and healthy tissues from dogs going through biopsies or other surgical treatments. The development of new research techniques utilizing stored patient tissues in recent years allows a deeper understanding of cancer at the molecular and cellular level.

The tissue bank is designed to meet the highest standards. The bank will stand out by not only collecting and storing malignant tissues, but also healthy tissues from the same patients. This will allow for in vitro research.

The value of the tissue bank has been recognized by OHSU who is fully cooperating with the project through the sharing of information and training. Cora lives on at the tissue bank. Her tissues, both cancerous and healthy, will directly contribute to the advancement of critical research.
