






Daniel E. and Dorothy J. Petrequin Scholarship






Pet Memorial Program Academic Excellence Award






Dr. Wayne and Jean Rehn Scholarship in Veterinary Medicine


Emerald Dog Obedience Club of Eugene Scholarship




Dr. Ed Scott Memorial Scholarship














Good Boy Barney Award in Honor of Michael Harms, DVM

Rebecca Camden Veterinary Endocrinology Scholarship






Carolina Cabaret Memorial Scholarship


Outstanding Resident Award




Zoetis Research Excellence Award

Dr. Dolan's research program is focused on two main areas. The first is the biology of antigen presentation, the process by which the cells of the body alert the adaptive immune system to the presence of intracellular pathogens, such as viruses, or oncogenic transformation. The second is the study of immune responses in wild animal populations as it relates to disease spread. His goal is to develop a variety of assays that can be used by researchers in the field to determine the relative immune status of animals depending on their environment and interactions with each other.


