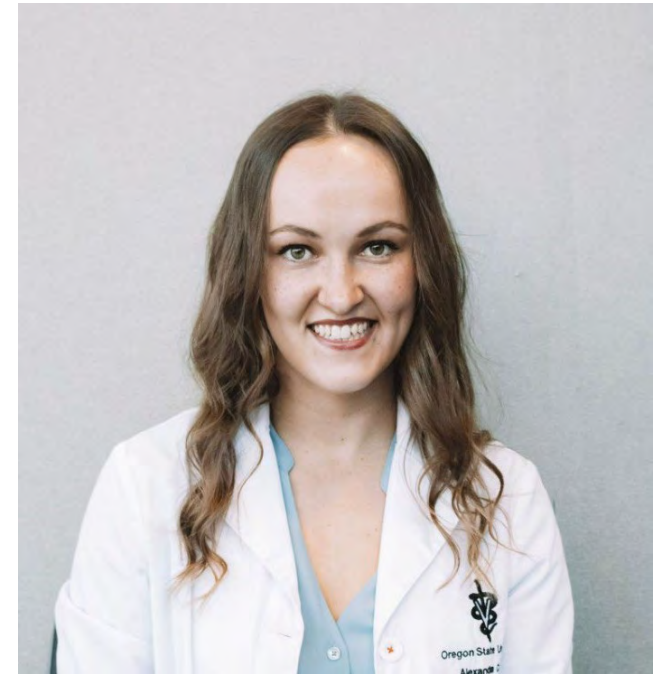


Carolina Cabaret Memorial Scholarship

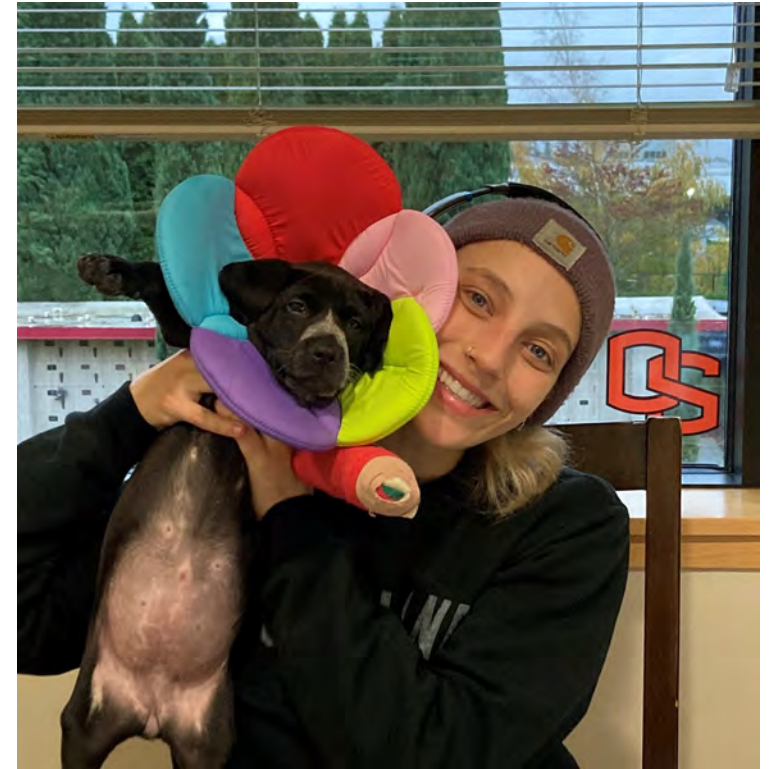
The American Animal Hospital Association Award for Proficiency in Primary Care recognizes one fourth-year veterinary student proficient in primary care.

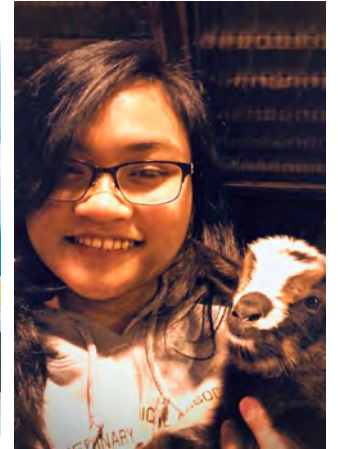

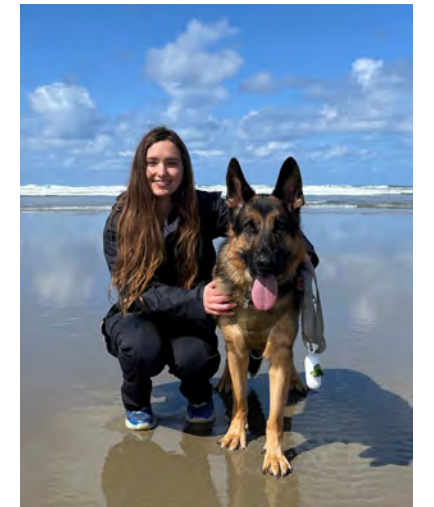

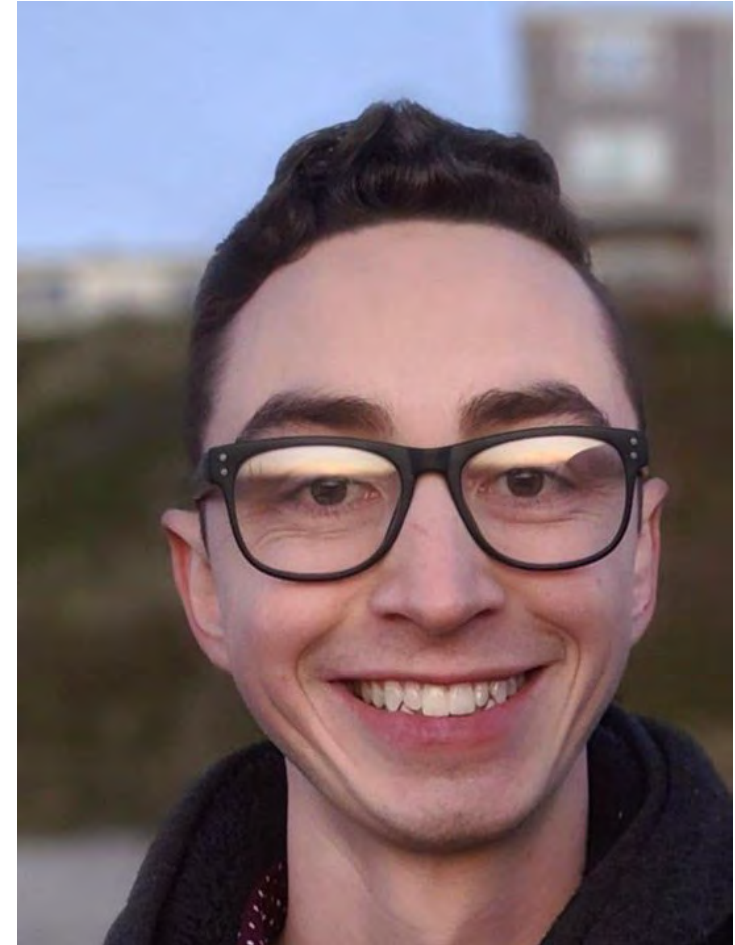
Graduate Student/House Officer Awards
