The scholarship was established by George Lamont in honor of his parents Creston and Dorothea in 1986. This scholarship is given to students with an interest in the poultry industry.






Daniel E. and Dorothy J. Petrequin Scholarship





Andres Family Scholarship Fund




Sharon and Cliff Burgess are longtime supporters of the college and established this scholarship for students from Oregon to help with educational costs.

Dr. Michael Bellinghausen endowed this scholarship to support students with financial need, giving preference to students from groups historically underrepresented in the veterinary medicine profession.




Emerald Dog Obedience Club of Eugene Scholarship




North West Camelid Foundation Scholarship






Shane Brown Memorial Scholarship




Dr. Joe and Jane Snyder Senior Award



Zoetis Distinguished Teacher Award


