

## Itinerary for the Externship Training Program at Karnataka Veterinary, Animal and Fisheries Sciences (KVAFSU) University during the month of July 2023

<b>Arrival of Students</b>	:	Approximately 28 <sup>th</sup> June 2023
<b>Duration</b>	:	One month inclusive of orientation and wrap-up
<b>July 1 2023</b>	:	Orientation for Externship Program
<b>1<sup>st</sup> week of July 2023</b>	:	Clinical training in <b>Medicine</b>
<b>4 Days of Trip 1</b>	:	Zoo, Safari, National Parks, Tea Estates, Heritage sites
<b>One week</b>	:	Clinical training in <b>Surgery</b>
<b>4 Days of Trip 2</b>	:	Equine breeding farm, Elephant Camp, Zoo, Jog Falls, Bird sanctuary, Heritage sites
<b>One week</b>	:	Clinical training in <b>Gynaecology and Obstetrics</b>
<b>Additional Trips</b>	:	Visit to Peripheral Hospital, Farms, Bannerghatta national Park, IAH & VB (vaccine manufacturing), Race course, Rabies unit and related Neighboring Institutes.
<b>After July 31</b>	:	Students interested in additional experience at Zoo or Equine center or other institutions can be arranged. Please plan in advance.
<b>Stay</b>	:	Students will be accommodated in the International Hostel on campus on payment as per KVAFSU rules (\$5-\$8/day). Dean, Veterinary College, Bangalore, and International Coordinator, KVAFSU and Dr. Manoj K. Pastey, Associate Professor, Head, Molecular Diagnostic Laboratory, Oregon State University will coordinate the travel plan of students and stay.
<b>Coordinator and Mentors</b>	:	The Dean, Veterinary College, Bangalore will nominate Mentors for KVAFSU.

- Selected students will receive \$4000 from the Department of Biomedical Sciences towards India Trip Expenses.
